Our Goal

The Center for a Sustainable University (KNU) is an interdisciplinary group dedicated to the **advancement of sustainability at Universität Hamburg**. The KNU acts as a **research network** and **think-tank for innovations** in new approaches, concepts and methods **within the context of sustainability**.

Defining Sustainability

The KNU is an **information platform** for **four dimensions** of sustainability:

RESEARCH

How can we define and develop sustainable research?

REFLECTION ON SCIENCE

What does sustainability in science actually mean? And how can we cultivate it?

DIDACTIC

What are the characteristics of sustainable education? And how do we facilitate it?

INSTITUTIONAL

What is sustainable governance? And how can we achieve it?

KNU Teams and Topics

The KNU operates through five teams dedicated to furthering sustainability at Universität Hamburg:

1. Sustainable University

Team 1 supports research projects and interdisci plinary exchange forums for sustainability. Team 1 also tests sustainable concepts.

2. Sustainability in Education

Team 2 focuses on the research and develop ment of sustainable education concepts. They act as sustainability consultants for the Univer sitätskolleg and provide input for quality management in teaching.

3. Postdoctoral Research Group "Sustainable Future"

Team 3 is composed of talented young researchers (fellowship scholars) from all disciplines of the University who develop and implement sustainability related research topics.

4. Sustainability in Higher Education Administration

Team 4 works towards the development and implementation of sustainable governance at the University, institutionalizes sustainable administration as well as develops, tests and implements sustainable projects in higher education administration.

5. Student Teams - MacheN!

Team 5 is a network for sustainability focused student-run initiatives at the University (funded by KNU – MacheN!).
